YOU SHOULD SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING TO THE EDITORIAL BOARD:

- **The manuscript of the article in electronic form**, in Ukrainian or English, designed in accordance with the requirements.
- **Abstract of the article** (in a separate file) in Ukrainian and English, with metadata of the authors and the scientific supervisor, namely: full name of the author (level of higher education, place of study) and the scientific supervisor (academic degree, academic title, position, place of work); E-mail of the corresponding author.

Authors are personally responsible for the accuracy of the terms, names, data, quotes, statistics, etc. in the article.

All manuscripts submitted for publication are subject to double-blind peer review.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PUBLICATIONS IN THE SCIENTIFIC STUDENT DISCOURSE JOURNAL

1. ARTICLE REQUIREMENTS

1.1. Manuscripts in Ukrainian or English that have not been previously published or submitted for publication to other editions are submitted to the editorial board.

- volume of materials: 5-10 A-4 pages in the Microsoft Word text editor;
- formulas and graphs performed using special MS Office editors;
- font: Times New Roman;
- font size – 14 pt;
- 1.0 line spacing;
- all margins: 20 mm on each side;
- formulas are placed in the center, numbered along the right edge;
- pages are not numbered.

1.2. The structure of a scientific article includes the following obligatory elements:

- Introduction;
- Analysis of recent research and publications;
- Formulation of the purpose of the article (statement of the objective);
- Description of the research methodology (structure, sequence);
- Presentation of the main material and obtained scientific findings;
- Conclusions and prospects for further research in this area.

2. ABSTRACT REQUIREMENTS

2.1. Abstract is a brief summary of a larger research paper. The abstract is the main source of information in national and foreign information systems and databases indexing the journal, as well as in search engines.

2.2. Volume of the abstract: it should be at least 700 characters in Ukrainian; at least 1800 characters (including spaces) in English.

2.3. Structure and content of the abstract:

- Title of the article
- Purpose
- Methods
- Results

3. REQUIREMENTS FOR THE LIST OF REFERENCES:

3.1. References should be drawn up in accordance with DSTU 8302-2015, or one of the [International Citation and Reference Styles for scientific papers](#) should be used, including:

- MLA style (Modern Language Association): is used for humanities (philosophy, religion, foreign languages, art);
- APA style (American Psychological Association): is used in social sciences (sociology, law, psychology);
- Chicago Style (Turabianstyle): is used in physical, natural and social sciences;
- Harvard Referencing style (BSI - British Standards Institution): used in humanities and social sciences;
- ACS style (American Chemical Society): chemistry and other natural sciences;

- AIP style (American Institute of Physics): physics and physical sciences;
- IEEE style (Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers): is used in engineering, electronics, telecommunications, computer science and information technology;
- Vancouver style: is used in medicine and physical sciences;
- OSCOLA (Oxford University Standard for Citation of Legal Authorities): law and jurisprudence;
- APS style (American Physics Society): physical sciences;
- Springer MathPhys Style: is used in mathematics, physics and statistics.

3.2. The list of used sources is drawn up in the order of references to them in the text, for example, [1, p. 3].

4. THE NEED TO CITE AND REFERENCE SOURCES USED:

4.1. 4.1. In the article, the author should provide references to sources, materials or individual results cited in the text.

4.2. All tables and figures should be accompanied by references to sources used or it should be noted that they are the author's own development.

4.3. Ignoring the rules of citation (absence of quotation marks in direct quotation, absence of references to sources, etc.) can lead to certain fragments of the article being qualified as plagiarism and, accordingly, to the return of the manuscript for revision.
